THE SCHOOL OF LAW

GENERAL

North Carolina Central University (NCCU) was chartered in 1909 as a private institution and opened to students in July of 1910. In 1923, when the General Assembly of North Carolina appropriated funds for the purchase and maintenance of the school, the institution became the first state supported liberal arts college for blacks in the United States. In July 1972, NCCU became one of the constituent institutions of the University of North Carolina system.

Fifty-four buildings now are located on the 105 acre campus in the heart of Durham, North Carolina, a city of more than 100,000 residents. NCCU has evolved into a multi-purpose urban university with a cosmopolitan student body and more than 300 persons on the instructional faculty.

Of a total enrollment of approximately 5,000 students, approximately 950 are enrolled in the graduate and professional schools. Approximately 600 students come from out of state; 60 percent are women; 22 percent are part-time students.

The North Carolina Central University School of Law was established in 1939. The school has been accredited by the American Bar Association since 1950.

BASIC PROGRAM OF STUDY AND DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The Day Program requires three academic years of full-time study for the Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree and the successful completion of a minimum of 88 semester hours of required and elective courses with a minimum cumulative average of 2.0. The year is divided into two equal semesters. The Day Program is designed for full-time students and requires substantially all of the student's time during the academic year.

In the first year, students take 31 semester hours of required courses (property, torts, criminal law, civil procedure, contracts, and legal methods) and an intensive writing class. The second year curriculum offers the student a range of core courses which build upon the first year foundation and provides the educational depth and breadth expected of a well rounded legal professional. The third year curriculum offers a variety of electives as well as clinical courses.

Legal research and writing are essential components of the entire educational program. All students participate in the

appellate moot court program which requires the preparation of legal briefs and oral arguments. All students must satisfy a writing requirement for graduation by undertaking a supervised research and writing project.

The Evening Program operates throughout the year, including two five week summer sessions. Students in this program can complete academic work for the J.D. degree in four calendar years by going to school year round. Eligibility requirements for graduation are substantially the same as for the Day Program.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

The Clinical Program consists of courses in evidence and trial practice with mock trials and oral arguments involving outstanding trial lawyers, appellate lawyers and jurists. Third year students represent indigent clients in civil matters and misdeameanor criminal cases under the supervision of practicing attorneys and faculty members.

It is not an unusual experience to walk into a courtroom in Durham or Raleigh and find one of our law students trying a case. The Clinical Program operates during the school year and summer months.

LAW LIBRARY AND PHYSICAL FACILITIES

The School of Law is located in the Albert L. Turner Building, a handsome four story, 73,000 square foot brick building. This modern facility provides an ideal physical environment for the study of law and enhances classroom exchange between professors and students.

The law library contains over 110,000 volumes of up-to-date research and educational materials. An aggressive acquisition program is in progress. Individual carrels, meeting rooms, computer terminals, and well furnished study areas provide an excellent atmosphere for academic pursuits.

ACTIVITIES

The North Carolina Central Law Journal, published semi-annually, is devoted to articles by legal scholars and to case notes and comments by students. Invitations to join the Law Journal are extended to students on the basis of academic achievement in their first year of law school. A writing competition in the fall semester permits second and third year students to compete for membership on the Law Journal.

The School of Law has a complete moot court and trial advocacy program. Intra - and interscholastic competitions provide students with an opportunity to write appellate briefs, participate in mock trials and appellate oral arguments, and counsel clients.

Student organizations at the School of Law include the Student Bar Association, Moot Court Board, American Bar Association/Law Student Division, Black Law Student Association, Women's Caucus, and Law Day Committee. There are chapters of three legal fraternities: Delta Theta Phi, Phi Alpha Delta and Phi Delta Phi.

ADMISSIONS

The School of Law welcomes students of all races to contribute to its diversity while continuing to pursue with vigor its historic mission of producing a substantial percentage of minority attorneys for the state and nation. The school gives considerable weight to the traditional criteria of the LSAT score and UGPA, but it also considers evidence that an applicant, who might be of doubtful admissibility on those factors alone, has demonstrated in other ways a likelihood of succeeding in the legal profession.

The School of Law seeks students who are more likely to contribute affirmatively to the learning of others by reason of their intellectual attainments, demonstrated emotional maturity and self-discipline, oral ability, social background, or exceptional capacity to benefit from the school's educational program. For this reason, applicants are asked to provide full information about their intellectual attainments, their personal achievements, employment experience, and social background.

FACULTY

The School of Law has nineteen full-time faculty members and administrators. Faculty members earned their law degrees from the following institutions: Catholic U.; U. of Chicago; Cornell U.; Duke U.; Georgetown U.; George Washington U.; Harvard U.; UNC-Chapel Hill; North Carolina Central U.; Rutgers U.; U. of Pennsylvania and U. of Texas. Seven faculty members hold advanced law degrees from Columbia U., Duke U., U. of Florida, or Harvard U. The faculty is composed of 11 black, 8 white, 9 male, and 10 female.

STUDENTS

The approximate enrollment for the Day Program ranges as follows: 248 students total; 50 percent black; 50 percent white and other minorities; 45 percent female; and 85 to 90 percent North Carolinians.
