**PLACEMENT NEWS:** Interviewing Skills Workshop - Tuesday, September 11, 1990 at 11:00 a.m. in Room 204. Second year students are encouraged to attend.

**RESUMES:** Every second and third year student should have a resume on file in the Placement Office. To date only fourteen (14) students have resumes on file. In spite of constant complaints about the small number of on-campus recruiters, especially North Carolina law firms, only **FOUR (4)** second year students had resumes and signed up to interview with Adams, Kleemeier (Greensboro). This required the Placement Director to solicit students to sign up for interviews. Each year, several recruiters cancel their on-campus interviews here because of a lack of student interest. Some of these recruiters no longer attempt to schedule interviews at our law school.

It only takes a short period of time to prepare a resume. If you need help, stop by the Placement Office.

PLACEMENT NEWS: In an effort to assist students in preparing their resumes (and signing up for interviews in a timely manner), the Placement Office is instituting the resumes on disk program. To participate in this program, you only have to: (1) type your resume onto a computer disk (pick up disk in the Placement Office); (2) buy (from any store) some heavyweight paper; and (3) bring the disk (with resume on it) and paper to the Placement Office. Mrs. Hudson will then print your resume for you. The printer in the Placement Office is excellent with several fonts, therefore almost any look can be created. This resumes on disk program is cheap but professional in quality. You are encouraged to take advantage of it immediately.
