I am pleased to introduce you to many of the talented and energetic students here at the North Carolina Central University School of Law. These students are seeking summer and permanent employment with law firms and agencies throughout the country.

North Carolina Central University has chosen to remain a relatively small law school and is selective in its admissions. Most recently, we offered admission to only 256 of almost 1000 applicants to enroll an entering class of 106 students in the Day Program and 27 students in the Evening Program.

The curriculum at the School of Law is challenging and intellectually demanding. It prepares our students to be effective members of the legal profession, whether as practicing attorneys, members of the judiciary, or other legal professionals in government, business, or education. Our clinical program is designed to equip our students with practical skills training through representation of real clients with real legal issues. The clinical experiences currently offered at the School of Law include Civil Litigation, Criminal Litigation, Family Law, Small Business Development and Planning, Juvenile Justice, and Alternative Dispute Resolution. Our students have also earned distinctions in negotiation and trial advocacy competitions.

This brochure provides a biographical profile for each prospective employee, information about our faculty and facilities, and additional information about our curriculum. The School of Law

For over sixty years, the North Carolina University School of Law has surmounted incredible odds. It has a rich and brilliant history: one of racial segregation, adversity, triumph, transition, growth and development. It is truly a school of opportunity.

In 1939, the North Carolina General Assembly authorized North Carolina College for Negroes, as North Carolina Central University was then called, to establish a law school to provide an opportunity for a legal education for African Americans who, at that time, had no in-state option to receive a formal legal education. The law school formally opened for the study of law in the fall of 1940, enrolling a class of four. The first-year curriculum duplicated what law school students studied at the all-white law school in nearby Chapel Hill. Dean Maurice T. Van Hecke, who was also Dean of the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill School of Law, was dean from 1939 until 1942.

In 1942, Albert L. Turner became the Law School's first African American dean, serving for twenty-three years and establishing a sense of community. In 1944, the law school admitted its first women students. In 1965, the law school admitted its first white students. Enrollment at the law school jumped dramatically in the early 1970's. By 1972, the school's student gender and ethnic diversity had become a topic of newspaper articles. In 1981, the law school's Evening Program opened its doors, making it today the only evening law school program between Atlanta, Georgia and Virginia Beach, Virginia. In the early 1990s, the Trial Advocacy Board gained regional and national recognition for its excellence in trial advocacy. In 1995, the *National Jurist* Magazine named the NCCU School of Law the "Best Law School for Women." By 1996, the Law School had introduced two joint degree programs: the J.D./M.B.A. and the J.D./M.L.S., enabling students to receive each joint degree in four years. Today, the School of Law continues to be a "Central Force" in the state and nation. Governor Mike Easley '76 is the Law School's first alumnus to serve as governor of

the State of North Carolina. Associate Justice G. K. Butterfield '74 serves on the North Carolina Supreme Court and is its only African American member. Judge Wanda G. Bryant '82 is on the North Carolina Court of Appeals and is the Law School's first female alumna to serve in this capacity. Prominent civil rights attorney Fred David Gray recently held the Charles Hamilton Houston Chair in Civil Rights and Constitutional Law. Attorney Gray represented Rosa Parks and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in pivotal civil rights cases, including those that emanated from the historic Montgomery, Alabama Bus Boycott.

As a school of opportunity, the Law School takes promising students and strives to encourage, guide and inspire them. The Law School continues to celebrate diversity and nurture the seeds of public service. Most importantly, it continues to prepare lawyers to navigate confidently through our legal system, to promote fairness and justice, to serve their clients and communities well, and to foster change when legal systems and processes interfere with the search for the truth.

Accreditation

The North Carolina Central University School of Law is fully accredited by the North Carolina State Bar Council and by the American Bar Association.

The Juris Doctor Program

North Carolina Central University School of Law offers two programs leading to the Juris Doctor degree: a full-time Day Program and a part-time Evening Program. The part-time Evening program is the only one between Atlanta, Georgia and Virginia Beach, Virginia. This program permits well-qualified students who cannot attend law school full-time the opportunity to pursue the Juris Doctor degree. Twenty-five (25) full-time professors, clinical instructors, and administrators, including 15 women and 15 minorities work with a number of distinguished adjunct and visiting professors to teach approximately 340 students

in both programs. In addition to having gender and ethnic diversity, students who attend the law school range in age from twenty-two to sixty-five and have diverse educational and socio-economic backgrounds and professional experiences.

The School of Law is committed to public service and recognizes the importance of promoting opportunity. While we share a curriculum and methodology with virtually every other law school in the United States, our educational program maintains certain distinctive aspects. Our strong clinical program exposes students to the practical side of the legal profession. In addition to preparing students for the broad range of traditional legal professional opportunities, the School of Law emphasizes providing legal services to underserved populations including poor, minority and rural communities. These are subtle, but essential, distinctions between the School of Law at North Carolina Central University and other institutions.

Day Program

Day program students must successfully complete six semesters or three academic years for their degree requirements. Acceptance of an admissions offer to the Day program represents a commitment to the full-time study of law. Any significant employment or involvement outside the School of Law is inconsistent with that commitment. Under American Bar Association Standard 305 (a)(iii), a student may not work in excess of twenty hours per week while attending a law school on a full-time basis.

Evening Program

The Evening Program is designed for particularly enterprising individuals who seek to earn a law degree while working full-time. Evening students come from many professional fields, including academia, medicine, scientific research, law enforcement, government and regulatory work. The Evening Program operates year-round. In addition to the fall and spring semesters, two five-

week summer sessions are offered each summer and are an essential part of the Evening Program. A student in the Evening Program ordinarily enrolls in three courses (8 to 10 credit hours) per semester. Typically, evening students complete their degree requirements in four years, consisting of eight semesters and three summers.

Examinations and Grades

All tests and examinations are graded in terms of "A", "B", "C", "D", and "F", representing, respectively, excellent, good, satisfactory, poor, and failure. Plus and minus grades are used. In computing a student's grade point average and class standing a rigorous 4.0 scale is used. Students must have a "C" average at the end of each academic year to be eligible for continued enrollment and graduation. Our faculty members are encouraged to adhere to a "C" grade expectation curve. "F" grades must stand and cannot be expunged. Required courses must be repeated if an "F" is earned. Students are ranked once a year at the end of the spring semester

Graduation

The degree of Juris Doctor is granted upon a student's successful completion of a minimum of eighty-eight (88) credit hours of required and elective courses with a cumulative academic average of at least 2.00. In accordance with the American Bar Association Standards, course credits more than five years old lapse if a degree is not earned. For students enrolled in the Evening Program, course credits more than six years old lapse if a degree is not earned. Degrees with honors will be awarded as follows: summa cum laude to students with a grade point average of 3.50 or higher; magna cum laude to student with a grade point average of 3.30 to 3.49; and cum laude to students with a grade point average of 3.00 to 3.29 at the time of graduation.

The Curriculum

The School of Law curriculum is challenging and intellectually demanding. It prepares the student to be an effective member of the legal profession, whether as a practicing attorney, member of the judiciary, or other legal professional in government, business, or education. The curriculum includes a writing program in each of the three years of full-time law study or four years of part-time law study, focusing on general legal writing, and advocacy writing. At North Carolina Central University School of Law, every student is offered an opportunity to become thoroughly grounded in the fundamentals of the law. The curriculum does not focus on the legal rules of any particular jurisdiction but instead, like most law schools, uses national materials and casebooks. Important North Carolina distinctions are also discussed. Emphasis is placed on the development of good legal analytical skills that are useful in any career choice.

The Writing Program

The School of Law emphasizes the development of effective writing and analytical skills. In the Day Program, this commitment is reflected in an intensive writing program that begins in the first semester and continues through the student's third year. During a student's first semester, the school commits the resources of full-time faculty members and the first-year class is subdivided into small "lab groups" in order to maximize feedback and contact with instructors. During the remaining five semesters, the students are required to write memoranda, briefs, legal letters, pleadings, and other documents, all of which are carefully criticized by writing instructors.

In the Evening Program, writing and individual feedback are also emphasized as students enroll in two semesters of Legal Reasoning and Analysis in their first year, Appellate Advocacy in their third year, and Senior Writing in their last year.

Clinical Experience Program

It is not unusual to walk into a courtroom in Durham, Raleigh or Hillsborough, North Carolina, and find an NCCU School of Law student trying a case in District Court with the assistance of a supervising attorney. The Clinical Experience Program operates year-round out of a state-of-the-art model law office located on the lower level of the law school. The Clinical Experience Program is truly an exceptional opportunity.

The Clinical Experience Program is designed to provide law students with practical skills training through representation of real clients with real legal issues. The clinical experiences currently offered at the School of Law are Civil Litigation, Criminal Litigation, Family Law, Business Development and Planning, Juvenile Justice, Pro Bono and Alternative Dispute Resolution. All students who are in good standing and who have satisfactorily completed the equivalent of at least three semesters of requirements for the J.D. degree are eligible to participate in a clinical program.

The clinical program consists of a required classroom component, and an internship or field placement component. During the classroom component, students enhance their understanding of the rules of evidence and procedure, and continue to refine their written and oral advocacy skills. Relevant simulations and exercises challenge students to perform under the pressures confronted by a practicing attorney.

After studying legal theory, rules of evidence, rules of civil procedure or criminal procedure, and case law in the classroom component of the clinical program, a student may opt to, in the second half of his or her clinical experience, practice law under the supervision of a licensed attorney during an internship or field placement. Students participating in the Clinical Experience Program work with judges, law enforcement officials, district attorneys, public defenders, legal services offices and North Carolina attorneys in private practice. This hands-on experience is an excellent opportu-

nity for students to gain self-confidence and to acquire the technical expertise to practice law.

In the Civil Litigation and Criminal Litigation Clinics, students work with a faculty supervising attorney to represent indigent clients referred by legal services offices or the Durham County Public Defender's Office. Students enrolled in these clinics may opt to practice law under the supervision of a licensed attorney. Students may also work in a district attorney's office in one of Durham's surrounding counties or with an attorney in private practice. Durham County is a pilot county for the new Family Court system. North Carolina Central University School of Law, through its Family Law Clinic, has been asked to work with the Durham County Trial Court Administrator to develop ways

to enable families to fully participate in this system. In order to provide a holistic approach to addressing the needs of families, the School of Law maintains a close working relationship with the Center for Child and Family Health-North Carolina. The Center for Child and Family Health is operated by NCCU, Duke University and UNC-Chapel Hill.

The Alternative Dispute Resolution Clinic, Small Business Clinic and Juvenile Law Clinic provide opportunities for students to gain practical experience in these areas. Students work under the direction of faculty or seasoned lawyers to resolve problems faced by their clients or other members of the community.

Description of Student Organizations

ACLU

The Law School's ACLU student organization focuses on awareness of current legal topics concerning civil liberties and rights. The group organizes "Brown Bag" Luncheons and sponsors various forums throughout the school year.

Black Law Students Association (BLSA)

In 1968, Algernon Johnson founded what was later the Black Law Students Association (BLSA) at the New York University Law School. The NCCU School of Law Chapter of BLSA is named the Lemarquis Dejarmon-Daniel George Sampson Chapter. BLSA seeks to articulate and promote the professional needs and goals of black law students, to foster and encourage professional competence and to bring about change in the legal system in order to make it responsive to the needs of the black community.

Christian Legal Society (CLS)

The CLS is an organization of students who share a common interest in integrating their faith and the practice of law.

FACES (Future Attorneys Challenging Elementary Students)

FACES is a group of NCCU law students who support the local Durham community by serving as tutors and mentors in elementary schools. Members of FACES organize a special day at the Law School, typically held during Law Week, when the elementary school students visit the Law School and learn about life as a law student.

Hispanic Law Students Association (HLSA)

HLSA works to increase awareness about issues affecting Hispanic-Americans and the legal profession.

Intellectual Property Society and Trademark Moot Court Board

The Intellectual Property Society provides a forum for networking, information exchange and education related to intellectual property law. This is advanced primarily through general meetings of members and special meetings featuring speakers from the profession, including the Law School faculty and alumni. The Trademark Moot Court Board participates in moot court competitions against other law schools.

Law Journal

The NCCU Law Journal, established in 1969, features articles, comments and case notes about various areas of the law by professors, practitioners and students.

Moot Court Program

The Moot Court Program, administered by a student-elected Moot Court Board, gives law students the opportunity to develop practical skills in legal research and writing, client counseling, appellate oral advocacy and negotiation. The Moot Court Program sponsors in-house competitions as well as teams that participate in competitions held throughout the United States.

National Conference of Black Lawyers (NCBL)

The mission of the NCBL is to serve as the legal arm of the movement for Black Liberation, to protect human rights, to achieve self determination of Africa and African Communities in the diaspora and to work in coalition to assist in ending oppression of all peoples.

Native-American Law Students Association (NALSA)

NALSA promotes awareness about issues affecting Native-American law students, and promotes broader cultural understanding of issues affecting Native-Americans.

Phi Alpha Delta Legal Fraternity

Phi Alpha Delta, the world's largest law fraternity, is a professional service organization serving law students, law schools and the legal profession.

Sports and Entertainment Law Society (SELS)

The purpose of this organization is to provide a forum for education and discussion about sports and entertainment law. SELS also strives to facilitate contacts within the sports and entertainment industries by keeping members abreast of upcoming conferences and forums on both the local and national levels.

Student Bar Association (SBA)

The SBA serves as the governmental voice of the student body. The SBA is the liaison between the student body and the Law School administration and faculty, and furthers professional and social interest among all students enrolled in the Law School.

Trial Advocacy Program

The Trial Advocacy Program, administered by a student-elected Trial Advocacy Board, is a program in which students have the opportunity to gain skills and experience in trial and litigation techniques. The Board sponsors in-house competitions, and also sends teams to various competitions around the country. NCCU trial teams have received national recognition.

Women's Caucus

The Women's Caucus provides a forum for discussion of issues facing women in the judicial process, women as professionals, and women in our society, and for networking among women law students and women attorneys in North Carolina. The group sponsors programs and workshops related to various women's issues, such as an Annual Women Judges Forum.
