PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It is an honor and a privilege to serve as President of the North Carolina Central University School of Law Alumni Association for the 1993-94 term. I am confident that you share my sense of gratitude to the School of Law for providing a sound legal education and the foundation upon which to build a successful career. Please join me this year in supporting our Alumni Association and the Law School.

The Alumni Association provides each of us with the means to give something back to the Law School. We each have something to contribute, whether our contribution takes the form of financial support or a commitment of time and energy. The Alumni Association provides needed assistance to the Law School. It also provides us with a meaningful forum in which we can work together as NCCU alumni to help each other enrich our own lives and careers. One of the responsibilities we have as Alumni is to voice our support or concern for the mission of the Law School and the path the Law School takes toward the goal of producing first-rate attorneys. It has

Chancellor Chambers has urged the faculty to consider making changes to the admissions process so as to place more emphasis on objective criteria, undergraduate grade point average and LSAT score, and less emphasis on the applicant's social, economic or experiential background.

In response to Chancellor Chambers' request the faculty recently approved the following Mission Statement:

The mission of the North Carolina Central University School of Law is to provide a challenging and broad-based educational program designed to stimulate intellectual inquiry of the highest order, and to foster in each student a deep sense of professional responsibility and personal integrity so as to produce competent and socially responsible members of the legal profession.

In achieving this mission the Law School subscribes to the following joint statement of the American Bar Association, American Association of Law Schools,

and the Law School  
Admissions Council:

[A] student body that is diverse with respect to sex, ethnicity, race, and economic, educational, and experiential backgrounds is essential to a quality legal education. Ours is a diverse society, and thus law students, before entering the legal profession, must obtain both a wide range of perspectives concerning the impact of law on various segments of our population, and a deeper understanding of law and justice in this increasingly complex society.

This statement is particularly poignant for a law school founded to educate African Americans. In keeping with its historical role, an important aspect of the Law School's mission is to attract capable persons from diverse backgrounds who are committed to public service and to meeting the needs of people and communities that are underserved by or that are under-represented in the legal profession.

You may address your concerns or opinions about Chancellor Chamber's proposal or the Mission Statement to me, to Dean Wright, or to Chancellor Chambers.

Again, I look forward to serving as your President during the coming year. Please join me in making our Alumni Association the best that it can be. Become a dues paying member in the Association by completing the Dues Form included in this Newsletter and sending it in along with your dues payment. Although \$25 seems a small sum, as our dues paying membership grows, we will be able to more effectively assist the Law School and provide better services to the students and to our members.
