NOTICE: Students who do not pre-register will be given last preference in the January, 1991 registration process and will receive appointment cards for the final day of registration.

GRADES: All Grades earned by Students who take law courses at either Duke or UNC-Chapel Hill during the Fall and Spring semesters under the inter-institutional agreement will be computed into the student's grade point average (GPA). Only Grades of "C" or better which are earned during the summer sessions will be accepted at the Law School (See Rule 1.07-02 of the Student Handbook) Students who wish to enroll in courses at Duke, UNC-Chapel Hill or other law schools must receive the permission of Dean Wright before enrolling in the course.

PARKING: Students continue to illegally park in the Law School parking lot. The continuation of this practice will subject those students who violate the University's parking rules to disciplinary action by the Law School.

OC1 - Resumes will be forwarded to Smith, Anderson, Blount, Dorsett, Mitchell & Jernigan (Raleigh, NC) on Friday, October 26, 1990. Firm resume and sign-up sheet are available in the Placement Resource Library.

Pre-screen RESULTS: The receipt of pre-screen results will be announced in the Weekly. Students selected for interviews should, when asked, stop by the Placement Office to sign up for an interview time. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that his/her name is added to the new schedule.

NO SHOWS: If you are unable, FOR WHATEVER REASON, to keep a scheduled interview appointment, you MUST notify the Placement Office. Many of the recruiters travel a long distance to come to the law school to interview YOU. It is inexcusable for students to forget interview times; interview schedules are posted in the Placement Office at least two days prior to scheduled interviews and interview dates are published in the Weekly. **POLICY:** Students who do not show up for interviews (without giving prior notice to the Placement Office) will be prohibited from interviewing with any on campus recruiters for ONE WEEK.

INTERVIEWS: U.S. Department of Agriculture interviewed 15 students on Thursday, October 18; Duke Power Company interviewed 12 students on Tuesday, October 23; State Farm Insurance Company interviewed 10 students on Tuesday, October 23.

KNOW YOUR RECRUITER: A common criticism voiced by our on campus recruiters is that the interviewed students HAVE NOT read their firm's resume. All recruiters view this negatively and are not impressed with students who know little or nothing about them. It is inexcusable for a student to go to an interview without first reading the firm's resume. FIRM RESUMES ARE KEPT IN THE INFORMATION NOTEBOOK IN THE PLACEMENT OFFICE. AT LEAST TWO DAYS PRIOR TO AN ON CAMPUS INTERVIEW, THE FIRM'S RESUME IS PLACED IN THE BOX OUTSIDE OF THE PLACEMENT RESOURCE LIBRARY. THIS INFORMATION IS DISCUSSED IN THE PLACEMENT BOOKLET!
