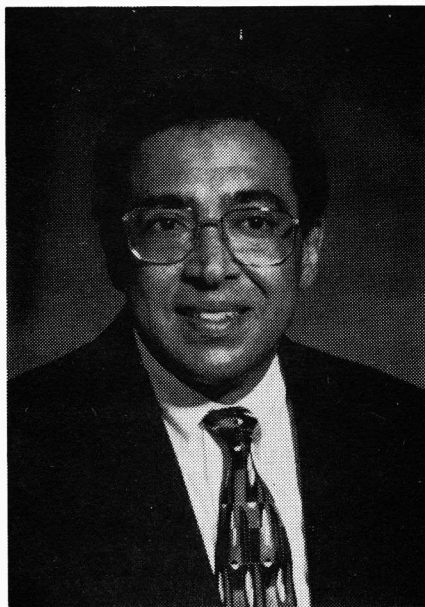

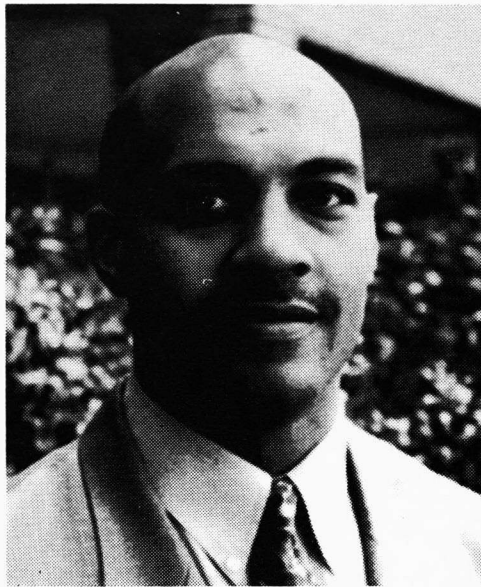

Keynote Speaker: Judge Patricia Timmons-Goodson

North Carolina Court of Appeals

Regal University Hotel, Durham, NC 7 pm.



Patricia Timmons-Goodson was appointed Judge of the Court of Appeals of North Carolina on January 15, 1997 after serving 12 years as a District Court Judge of the 12th Judicial District. As Governor James B. Hunt, Jr. announced her appointment, he said, "Judge Timmons-Goodson has proven her knowledge of the law, her fairness and her strength. We need those qualities in our courts today." The 12-member Court of Appeals sits in panels of three judges and hears cases appealed from trial courts and administrative agencies throughout North Carolina.

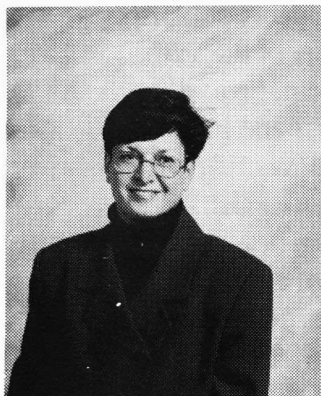
Judge Timmons-Goodson, the oldest of six children, is the product of a military, traveling in different parts of the United States and Europe. Upon her father's retirement, the family settled in Fayetteville, where she graduated from high school in 1972. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Speech from UNC-CH. She was actively involved in campus life, serving in various leadership positions, including Secretary of the Student Body. Judge Timmons-Goodson was recognized for her leadership, scholarship, and service to UNC with inductions into two campus honoraries--the Order of the Old Well and the Order of the Valkyries. Her 1979 law degree is from the UNC School of Law, where she was selected through competition for membership on the Holderness Moot Court Bench.

After law school, Judge Timmons-Goodson was appointed District Manager of the 1980 Census for a 10-county area. She then became an Assistant District Attorney in the 12th Judicial District, and in 1983 she joined Lumbee River Legal Services as staff attorney.

As service to the community, she currently produces and co-hosts a monthly television show that highlights the local court system and its programs. Judge Timmons-Goodson frequently speaks to youth about the challenges ahead, emphasizing the importance of reaching their full potential. She also encourages law students, young lawyers, and others expressing an interest in the legal profession to achieve excellence. Her leadership and service to the judiciary of North Carolina have been recognized by many organizations. The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill named Judge Timmons-Goodson the 1992 Distinguished Young Alumna. In 1995, the North Carolina Legislative Black Caucus presented her its Leadership Award. In 1996, the Fayetteville Chapter of the NAACP named Judge Timmons-Goodson, the recipient of its SERVICE AWARD saying, "People attain worth and dignity by the multitude of decisions they make day by day. These decisions require courage, unselfish, and dedicated service."

Judge Timmons-Goodson's husband, Dr. Ernest Goodson, is an orthodontist practicing in Fayetteville. They are proud parents of two sons, Ernest, Jr., "Sonny", and Aaron. The Goodsons are active members of the First Baptist Church, Moore Street, Fayetteville, N.C., where Judge Timmons-Goodson teaches Sunday school.

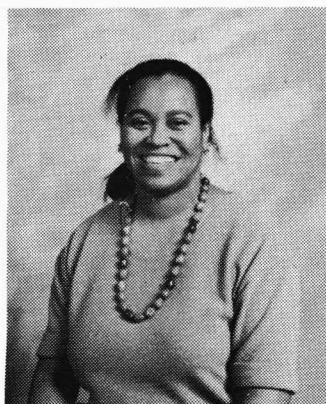
