LEARNING CENTER: The Permanent Learning Center will be closed on November 19, 1990 from 6 p.m. - 10:30 p.m. for the training of students from Durham Technical Community College.

LAW WEEK COMMITTEE: There will be a brief meeting of the Law Week Committee Monday, November 19th at 4:00 p.m in Room 100.

AIMS MENTORS: As many of you are aware, the AIMS Program is currently looking for a new "home." Principal Emily Scott of Lakewood Elementary School has requested our services. She has extended an invitation for us to visit Lakewood on November 19, 1990 (Monday) at 10:00 a.m. She and her staff will conduct a tour of the facilities and serve refreshments. The school is located about 1 mile from Rogers-Herr. Maps will be placed throughout the law school. Please join us on Monday morning for this brief visit. Thanks!

FIRST YEAR & SECOND YEAR STUDENTS: Some of the summer job programs for law students (Applications will be made available later this semester) require that applicants submit a copy of their UNDERGRADUATE transcript. In anticipation of this request, you should request a copy of your transcript NOW! Applications without the official transcript are incomplete and will not be processed by the employing agency!

RESUMES: Resumes on file in the Placement Office: 32 third year students (class size - 59) and 45 second year students (class size - 90).

PRE-SCREEN RESULTS: The receipt of pre-screen results will be announced in the Weekly. Students selected for interviews should, when asked, stop by the Placement Office to sign up for an interview time. It is the student's responsibility to make sure that his/her name is added to the new schedule.

NO SHOWS: If you are unable, FOR WHATEVER REASON, to keep a scheduled interview appointment, you MUST notify the Placement Office. Many of the recruiters travel a long distance to come to the law school to interview YOU. It is inexcusable for students to forget interview times; interview schedules are posted in the Placement Office at least two days prior to scheduled interviews and interview dates are published in the Weekly. **POLICY:** Students who do not show up for interviews (without giving prior notice to the Placement Office) will be prohibited from interviewing with any on campus recruiters for ONE WEEK.

KNOW YOUR RECRUITER: A common criticism voiced by our on campus recruiters is that the interviewed students HAVE NOT read their firm's resume. All recruiters view this negatively and are not impressed with students who know little or nothing about them. It is inexcusable for a student to go to an interview without first reading the firm's resume. FIRM RESUMES ARE KEPT IN THE INFORMATION NOTEBOOK IN THE PLACEMENT OFFICE. AT LEAST TWO DAYS PRIOR TO AN ON CAMPUS INTERVIEW, THE FIRM'S RESUME IS PLACED IN THE BOX OUTSIDE OF THE PLACEMENT RESOURCE LIBRARY. THIS INFORMATION IS DISCUSSED IN THE PLACEMENT BOOKLET!

OCI - The U.S. Department of Energy (Oak Ridge, Tenn.) will conduct on campus interviews on Friday, November 16, 1990. The final schedule is posted in the Placement Office.

OCI - The King's County District Attorney's Office (Brooklyn, NY) is interested in conducting on campus interviews at our law school on Friday, November 30, 1990. Any THIRD YEAR law student who would like to interview with this Office should stop by the Placement Office to sign his/her name on the INTEREST SHEET (DEADLINE IS NOVEMBER 15, 1990 - RESUMES WILL BE FORWARDED ON THE 15TH.)

OCI - The representatives from Smith, Anderson, Blount, Dorsett, Mitchell & Jernigan (Raleigh) interviewed 18 students on Thursday, November 8, 1990.

During the session, the Director will provide students with information on resume preparation, interviewing procedures, summer job opportunities, etc. All first-year students are encouraged to read their PLACEMENT BOOKLET and to ATTEND the session!
