NORTH CAROLINA BAR REVIEW COURSE SCHOLARSHIPS: Attention All Third-Year Students taking the July 1991 North Carolina Bar Examination. North Carolina Central University School of Law Alumni Association, Inc. has endowed four scholarships of \$250.00 each to be awarded to four NCCU third-year law students who will be taking the North Carolina Bar Examination. Check you student mail boxes or see Professor Jefferies for details.

AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION: The Family Law section of the American Bar Association is sponsoring an essay contest on current issues in Family Law. The contest is open to second and third-year students. Students may write on any aspect of family law. First prize is \$700; Second prize is \$500 and third prize is \$300. Interested students should contact Professor Amana, office number 122.

BAR EXAM STIPENDS: The Minorities in the Profession Committee of the North Carolina Bar Association has issued application packages for its Bar Exam Stipend Program for minority students. The stipends will be awarded to those minority graduates who need financial assistance while preparing for the July 1991 North Carolina Bar Exam. The Committee defines minority to include African American, Hispanic, and Native American students. Eligible third year students should obtain an application package from Dean Mills' office by Thursday, January 31, 1991.

NORTH CAROLINA BAR ASSOCIATION: The North Carolina Bar Association is sponsoring a Family Law essay contest. The topics are "Should North Carolina abolish 'Heart balm' actions?" or "Should alimony in North Carolina be fault based?" First prize is \$500 and second prize is \$200. The winning paper will be published in the Family Forum. Interested students should contact Professor Amana. Office Number 122.

STUDY GROUP: Professor Amana is considering starting a study group that would read and discuss writings in feminist jurisprudence; critical legal studies; law and economics; and critical race theory. She would like to know if there is sufficient interest in such a group. If you are interested, please see her.

IOLTA SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM: Students interested in participating must have complete applications in the Placement Office by Friday, February 15, 1991. A complete application consists of a five page writing sample, transcript of grades, and statement of interest.

POYNER & SPRUILL: First-year students interested in being considered for a summer clerkship position should sign up in the Placement Office by Tues., February 12, 1991. The firm will only consider students in the top 20%, therefore, please wait until you have received all first-year grades before signing up. Also, make sure that your resume is on file.

INSTITUTE OF GOVERNMENT: First-year students interested in summer employment should sign up for an interview by February 6. In addition to having your resume on file, you will need to submit your grades and a writing sample to the Placement Office before the February 6 deadline. Interviews will be conducted on February 20.

SMITH, ANDERSON, BLOUNT, DORSETT, MITCHELL & JERNIGAN: First-year students who wish to interview should sign up in the Placement Office by February 6, 1991. On-campus interviews will be conducted on February 21.

N. C. JUSTICE DEPARTMENT SUMMER INTERNSHIP: Students who applied will

be notified as to whether or not they will be granted an interview. If an interview is granted, that student must stop by the Placement Office to sign up for an interview time. Twenty minute interviews will be conducted on campus on February 6, 1991.

N.C. LEGAL EDUCATION ASSISTANCE FOUNDATION: Applications are now being accepted for its Loan Repayment Assistance Program. To be eligible, an individual must have graduated from one of the five North Carolina law schools in 1982 or after and must work full-time in law-related employment in North Carolina for a federal, state, or local government agency; an organization that provides legal services to the poor; or a Section 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that has a law-related purpose. In addition, the individual must earn an annual salary of, and have adjusted gross income of, less than \$30,000. Applications are available from NC LEAF and the North Carolina law schools.
