**N.C. LEGAL EDUCATION ASSISTANCE FOUNDATION:** Applications are now being accepted for LEAF's Loan Repayment Assistance Program. To be eligible, an individual must have graduated from one of the five North Carolina law schools in 1982 or after and must work full-time in law-related employment in North Carolina for a federal, state, or local government agency; an organization that provides legal services to the poor; or a Section 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that has a law-related purpose. In addition, the individual must earn an annual salary of, and have adjusted gross income of, less than \$30,000. Applications are available from NC LEAF and the North Carolina law schools.
