**REGISTRATION FOR SUMMER '91 AND FALL '91 COURSES:** Registration for all continuing students is scheduled for Thursday, March 14th - Wednesday, March 20th from 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.

**PROCEDURE:** Present your blue Course Approval Card (signed by your Faculty Advisor) to Mrs. Brown and wait to receive a copy of your course schedule. (First Summer Session and Dual Session should be on one card, while Second Summer Session and Fall Semester courses should be on separate Course Approval Cards.) Evening program students should see Dean Solari for your course schedule copies.

**REGISTRATION REMINDER:** Day program students who wish to carry more than 16 semester hours or less than 8 semester hours need schedule approval from Dean Wright before presenting the course approval card. Day program students who wish to take courses in the evening program must have Dean Wright's approval. Evening program students who wish to take courses in the day program must have both Dean Wright's and Dean Solari's approval.

Students who register at this time will have the option of avoiding the long lines at registration if they wish to take advantage of the Advance Pay Period or pay by credit card by calling (919) 560-6209.

**FALL, 1991 SCHEDULE CHANGE:** The meeting time for Entertainment Law has been changed to 5:30-6:20 p.m.

**SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS:** The Charles W. Williamson Bar Foundation has announced its scholarship competition.
