LIBRARY SUGGESTION BOX

SUGGESTION: To take one set of the NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES off reserve and make it available to students and faculty.

RESPONSE: A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO ONE SET OF NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES WAS PLACED IN THE NORTH CAROLINA ALCOVE FOR GENERAL USE. SEVERAL VOLUMES WERE REPORTED MISSING FROM THE SHELF ALMOST IMMEDIATELY. THOSE VOLUMES NEVER RETURNED TO THE SHELF AND EVENTUALLY HAD TO BE REPLACED. IN AN EFFORT TO ENSURE THE AVAILABILITY OF ALL CHAPTERS OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES FOR ALL PATRONS, IT IS NECESSARY THAT WE KEEP THEM ON RESERVE.

SUGGESTION: To place STRONG'S INDEX where it is available to the faculty and students.

RESPONSE: STRONG'S INDEX 3D & 4TH ARE AVAILABLE AT THE CIRCULATION /RESERVE DESK. STRONG'S INDEX 2D CAN BE FOUND IN THE KFN SECTION OF THE GENERAL STACKS UPSTAIRS. DUE TO THE HIGH USAGE RATE OF THIS PARTICULAR SET OF BOOKS, IT IS NECESSARY TO KEEP IT ON RESERVE TO ENSURE IT'S AVAILABILITY TO ALL PATRONS.
