LIBRARY: Beginning September 1, 1991, Library hours will be extended to 9:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, and to 10:00 p.m. on Sunday.

LIBRARY SUGGESTION BOX - SUGGESTION: I feel there should be a stiffer penalty for people who keep reserve material longer than the allotted time period, i.e. \$5.00 per day.

RESPONSE: Section 4.01-01 of the Student Handbook provides that a student will be fined \$1.00 for each hour reserve material is overdue with a maximum fine of \$5.00 per day, not to exceed \$20.00. Any student believed to be abusing the use of reserve materials is engaging in unprofessional conduct as defined under section 2.02-02 of the Student Handbook and will be brought before the Academic Disciplinary Committee in according to the procedures set out in Section 2.05. Reserve materials can be borrowed for a maximum of three (3) hours. If you find that three hours is insufficient time, you may renew your borrowing time within the three hours. Reserve books may also be borrowed for overnight use three (3) hours before the Library closes. These books must be returned to the library within one (1) hour after the library opens the next morning. Heavily used library material are put on reserve so that all students will have access to them.

SUGGESTION: Professor Bracy recommended the hornbook on Constitutional Law by Nowak and Rotunda (4th ed.). If we don't have this on reserve, can we get it? If we only have one (1) or two (2) copies of the 4th ed., can we get additional copies?

RESPONSE: Two copies of the 4th ed. of Constitutional Law by Nowak and Rotunda have been ordered. It will take approximately six (6) weeks for these books to arrive and be processed (made ready for the shelf). Due to State budgetary cutbacks, we are unable to purchase multiple copies of any publications at this time. Until the 4th ed. arrives, there are four (4) copies of the 3d ed. available at the circulation/reserve desk.

SUGGESTION: Teachers should be required to sign reporters out. As it is now, books are missing (St. Ct. Reporters) and no one knows if any of the teachers have them!

RESPONSE: Faculty-members have unlimited use of all library materials. They are requested to check out any library materials that they take out of the Library, particularly if they plan to use the material for an extended period of time. Most faculty will check out library materials to be used outside the Library.
