Please do not sign up for interviews with employers unless you intend to interview with that employer. Several students have been granted interviews with employers and have then declined the interview. This not only leaves a bad impression on the employer but also takes an opportunity away from another student who could have been chosen for that interview slot.

Students who have signed up for interviews should check in the Placement Office 1 to 4 days prior to the interview date to determine whether you have been granted an interview.
