FINAL EXAMINATION RULES: Final Examinations will be administered December 5-18, 1991. Examination rules will be posted on student bulletin boards, on Associate Dean Joyner's office door and are published in the October 2nd Law School Weekly. If you have questions about examination rules, contact your professor or Dean Joyner. Students are also prohibited from submitting the work product of another as their own and from engaging in any other act of academic dishonesty. See Rules 2.02-01 and 2.02-03 of the Student Handbook. Violations of these rules are serious and will subject the offender to disciplinary action. See Rule 2.03-01 of the Student Handbook.

Each student must obtain an examination number from Ms. Brown or from Assistant Dean Solari (only evening students). That number is to be used on each examination answer sheet and blue book. The use of any other number is prohibited. Students are also responsible for reporting violations of the examination rules and acts of academic dishonesty to Associate Dean Joyner.

SECURITY: Keep an eye on your property and be mindful of the safety of others. Don't leave your property unattended. Suspicious activities and people should be reported to Security or to Deans Wright or Joyner. The back doors and doors to the Moot Court Room should not be propped open because

that provides an opportunity for unsavory characters to enter the Law School without detection. When you prop the doors open, you endanger each person in the Law School. We must watch out for each other if the opportunity for criminal activities is to be minimized.
