LIBRARY SUGGESTION BOX - SUGGESTION: The open ceiling design of the new rooms at the front of the library is not conducive to group studying due to the passage of sound and the fact that people in the corridor knock on the windows to

RESPONSE: NO! The Law School is a "smoke free" building which means no smoking in any room in the building. The newly constructed study rooms were not necessarily designed for group study for obvious reasons but can be reserved to be used for group study. If one of the rooms is being used for group study, a person who desires quiet study should go inside the library or to his/her carrel. Group study rooms are an asset to the library, not a requirement.

SUGGESTION: That students be reminded that the new study room and reading area are to be utilized in a quiet manner given the fact that they are not covered.

RESPONSE: "Quiet Please" signs are being made to be placed throughout the library in hopes that students will be reminded that the entire library should be used in a quiet manner.
