LAW OFFICE MANAGEMENT COURSE:

Attorney Thigpen submitted the following class assignment for January 10, 1992: For the first class on January 10, 1992, I would like for each of you to assume that you have graduated from North Carolina Central University School of Law, you have just received your letter informing you that you have passed the bar and you are now ready to open a solo practice.

Please prepare a written budget which reflects the type of office you would like to open. You should include in your budget all items you deem necessary to open your office.
