JOB ANNOUNCEMENT: TUTORS

-Students interested in serving as tutors for the 1992-93 school year can pick up an application from Attorney Meddock in Room 216. The qualifications are:

- 1) overall class standing in the top 25%;
- 2) a grade of A- or better in the class for which you'd like to tutor (unless there were no grades that high in the class);
- 3) a demonstrated ability to communicate effectively; and
- 4) the ability to function effectively with the course professor.

Additionally, students who have teaching experience or have demonstrated outstanding legal ability through research or practical experience may be considered for tutorial positions. Because of the required time commitment, students who are research assistants or who have significant outside jobs are ineligible for these positions.

Students earn \$350 to \$500/semester and are required to attend the class for which they will serve as a tutor.
