CAREER SERVICES NEWS

Thank you to all of the students who attended the NCCU Law Alumni Panel Discussion on Friday, September 10, 1999. The panel discussion was held in conjunction with the 2nd Annual Law Alumni Reunion. Guests on the panel included The Honorable Peter Rogers, Court of Common Pleas-Criminal Trial Division, Philadelphia, PA; The Honorable Eleanor Kinnaid, N.C. State Senate and N.C. Prisoner Legal Services; Attorney Brewington Croswell, AA License Restoration Center, Philadelphia, PA; and Attorney Morris Billingslea, Allstate Insurance Co. Orange, NJ.

The **fall interview season** is here. Our first set of interviews were conducted today by the law firm of Womble, Carlyle, Sandridge & Rice. Second, third and fourth year day and evening students who are interested in seeking employment for summer or permanent positions should schedule an appointment with Attorney Morgan to review your resume and discuss your employment search. Some deadlines have already passed and others are fast approaching. This initial conference will take approximately fifteen minutes and follow-up appointments will be scheduled as often as necessary. You should bring a draft of your resume to the conference. Please stop by to schedule an appointment.

Thank you to all students who have been using OCI+ during the fall semester. As we become more familiar with the system, it should prove to help streamline the job search process. If you are a 2L, 3L, or 4L day/evening student and have not yet picked up your login-in identification and password, please do so as soon as possible. We will transition into full use of this system by the beginning of the spring semester. Students who have picked up their password but have not yet accessed the system should do so, especially if you are participating in on-

campus interviews. Make sure that your email address is in the system so that you can receive instant notification of interviews and have access to the interview schedule to sign-up for a time.

EMPLOYMENT ANNOUNCEMENTS have been posted on the bulletin board outside the Career Services Office and will be posted on a continuing basis. The same announcements may also be accessed on the OCI+ system. As we transition into full use of OCI+ by the beginning of the spring semester, announcements will no longer be posted on the bulletin board. Please stop by the Career Services Office or visit the job postings section of OCI+ to review the various postings. The sign-up notebook is located in Room 201, or you may sign-up (bid) on-line.

On Wednesday, September 15th, Attorney Anne Gulyassy, a representative from the United States Department of Justice will visit our campus to discuss their Honors and Summer Intern program with interested 2Ls and 3Ls. Applications and program booklets will be distributed and she will answer any questions regarding the application process. Approximately 140 hires will be made for the Honors Program and approximately 128 for the summer intern program. Several NCCU law students have been hired in both programs over the past few years. Even though the program for 3Ls is termed Honors Program, neither program has a class standing cut-off that a student must meet in order to qualify. Factors beyond class rank are considered.

All students who signed-up to interview with the U.S. Attorney's Office-EDNC should stop by the Career Services Office to determine whether or not you have been granted an interview. If so, you may access the schedule on OCI+ or see Attorney Morgan. Hunton & Williams interviews have been rescheduled for September 28, 1999.
