North Carolina Prisoner Legal Services is now accepting applications for two paid summer positions. Grant recipients are also encouraged to apply. NCPLS is a non-profit organization that provides a range of services from advice about the prisoners' legal rights to representation in state and federal court. Summer interns do a wide variety of research projects, assist attorneys in court, and interview inmates. Summer positions are for ten weeks. The law school has received a grant in the amount of \$18,000 to be used to pay students participating in the IOLTA Public Service Internship Program. Six stipends in the amount of \$3,000 each will be awarded. Students receiving the stipends must work a minimum of ten weeks for a public interest organization in North Carolina that has been approved by IOLTA. First and second year students are eligible to receive the stipend. To apply, you should submit a resume, cover letter which details your interest in the organization that you have chosen, transcript, and letter from the organization stating that they will hire you for the summer if you are awarded the stipend. The deadline to apply for the stipend is March 8, 2000. If you have any questions regarding the application process or to view the Approved Placements list. please see Attorney Morgan.

Applications are available in the Career Services Office for the North Carolina Bar Association's 1L Minority Summer Law Clerkship Program. The purpose of the program is to give North Carolina's major law firms an inside track on recruiting some the state's most talented minority law students. If you are interested in this program, please be sure pick up an application. The deadline to submit your completed application to the Career Services Office is February 21st.

The Honorable Robert H. Edmunds, Jr., North Carolina Court of Appeals, has requested applications for a judicial clerkship to begin in August of 2000. Interested 3Ls should submit a cover letter, resume and writing sample. He is also accepting applications from 2Ls for a position to begin in August of 2001. Interested 2Ls should submit a resume and cover letter. Participation on the law journal is preferred for both. Materials may be submitted to Judge Edmunds at Post Office Box 388, Raleigh, NC 27602.
