LICENSING AND TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER CLASS

The school is offering its first class in Licensing and Technology Transfer at 5:00 p.m. on Mondays and Tuesdays this Spring semester. Professor Charles Smith will teach the class.

The course is designed to expose students to the marketing, negotiation, and contract drafting skills needed to transfer products of the mind between parties. While the subject matter of the transfer might be a patent, a trade secret, a trademark, a copyright, or even an endorsement deal for a sports or entertainment figure, the principles of licensing remain consistent.

The class will begin with a review of intellectual

property law and then focus on licensing and transfer issues. Contracts I and II are the most important pre-requisites. No science or technical background is needed or required.

Who should take the class? Students interested in Intellectual Property Law, Patent Law, Sports and Entertainment Law, and Business Law. This is one of the fastest growing areas of employment for attorneys and one in which our graduates are taking a lead.
