THE JUVENILE LAW CLINIC IS AVAILABLE FOR THE FIRST SUMMER SESSION
MAY 21 - JUNE 24, 2002

The NCCU School of Law Juvenile Law Clinic works with Durham County juveniles who are involved in delinquency hearings, and school administrative hearings for long-term suspensions. Law students provide direct legal services upon completion of the instruction and training on the North Carolina juvenile delinquency code and administrative code, and court and administrative procedure. The classroom component will consist of 30 to 40 hours of training and instruction, and the field component will consist of 60 to 70 hours. The Clinic is offered to rising 3Ls who have completed or are concurrently enrolled in the prerequisite courses (evidence, criminal law, criminal procedure, civil procedure, and trial practice).

Classes will be held on May 23rd, 24th, 30th, and 31st from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. From June 3rd through June 24th each student will be assigned cases in Durham County Juvenile Court. Juvenile court is held on Mondays and Tuesdays. Students will also be given the option to spread their caseload through mid July.

CAREER SERVICES NEWS

The Career Services office is now accepting applications from first and second year students for its Summer Judicial Clerkship/Public Service Internship Program. The stipend pays \$2,000 for six weeks to students who either intern for a public service organization or clerk for a judge. To apply, please submit a resume, letter of interest and transcript. You may choose the organization or judge for whom you wish to intern and your letter should include this information. The deadline to apply is Thursday, April 18, 2002.
