The FIFTH Annual NALP/NAPIL PUBLIC INTEREST CAREER FAIR offers an important opportunity for second and third year students to learn about a wide array of career opportunities in the public interest arena. NCCU School of Law has registered for the fair so that you may take advantage of this opportunity. The fair will be held on Friday, Oct. 16, 1992 at the Georgetown Conference Center, Georgetown University, 3800 Reservoir Road N.C., Washington, D.C. NALP and NAPIL do not schedule interviews. **STUDENTS MUST CONTACT EMPLOYERS DIRECTLY, WHO WILL ARRANGE THEIR OWN INTERVIEW SCHEDULES.** A list of participating employers as well as a memo explaining the interview scheduling procedure is available in the Placement Resource Library in the "NALP/NAPIL PUBLIC INTEREST CAREER FAIR" binder. Students who wish to attend should sign-up on the appropriate sheet in the binder. All students are encouraged to send resumes to participating employers by Sept. 25th. You will have a better chance of scheduling interviews if you contact employers early.

If you signed-up to interview with the law firm of Smith, Anderson, Blount, Dorsett, Mitchell & Jernigan, please check the Placement Bulletin Board to determine whether or not you have been granted an interview. If so, please sign-up for you interview time immediatly. Interviews will be conducted on Thursday, September 24, 1992.

A series of information sessions on different areas of practice will be sponsored by the Placement Office throughout this school year. Practitioners in the different areas, many of whom are NCCU Law Alumni, will visit our campus and give you some insight into the realities of the practice of law and advice on how to get your practice or career started. Attorney Fred Whitfield will visit our campus on Wednesday, September 23, 1992, to talk with students about his Sports Law practice. Attorney Whitfield is a 1988 graduate of NCCU School of Law. He and Mobile, Alabama Attorney Richard Woods are partners in First Team, Inc., an agency that represents professional athletes. Clients of First Team, Inc. include Bo Jackson of the Los Angeles Raiders and Chicago White Sox, Cornelius Bennett of the Buffalo Bills, Tripp Welborne of the Minnesota Vikings and Bobby Bowden, Head Coach of the Florida State Seminoles Football Team. Attorney Whitfield is also the founder and director of Achievements Unlimited, a summer basketball camp, where staying in school and saying no to drugs get as much emphasis as the fundamentals of basketball. His longtime friend, Michael Jordan, always makes an appearance at his camp. All students are encouraged to come by the Moot Court Room at 3:00 to talk with Attorney Whitfield.

Attorney Reginald Shuford will visit our campus on Wednesday, September 23, at 4:00, to talk with students about Judicial Clerkships. Attorney Shuford is a 1991 graduate of the University of North Carolina School of Law. Upon graduation, Attorney Shuford was judicial clerk to the Honorable Henry E. Frye of the North Carolina Supreme Court. After completion of his clerkship, he joined the law firm of Richard Schwartz and Associates. If you are interested in applying for a judicial clerkship, this session should prove helpful. Also, Law Clerk Handbooks will be made available to students. Attorney Bill Burlington, U.S. Dept. of Justice - Federal Bureau Prisons, will visit our campus on Thursday, September 24, at 3:00 p.m. in the Moot Court Room to discuss employment opportunities with the U.S. Dept. of Justice. Students who are interested in applying for the Summer Law Internship Program (2Ls) or the Attorney General's Honors Program (3Ls) should attend. Approximately 125 Summer Law Interns will be hired and approximately 230 Honor Program Attorneys. NCCU School of Law is a regional interview site. The interviews will be conducted on Thursday, November 5th and students from other states will travel here to interview. All students are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity. The deadline to submit applications directly to the U.S. Dept. of Justice is Wednesday, September 30, 1992.

Students are requested to adhere to Employers' hiring criteria when signing-up for on-campus interviews or to have resumes forwarded to Employers. If you do not meet the stated criteria, your resume will not be forwarded.
