#### "CELEBRATION OF A PIONEER"

Dean Sampson has rendered over forty-two years of commitment to North Carolina Central University School of Law. In 1950, Dean Sampson became a member of the Law faculty. From 1965 to 1969 he served as Dean of the Law School. He continues to teach on a part-time basis.\*

Not only has Dean Sampson served the Law School as a faculty member, he has also fought for the survival of our Law School. In 1965, Governor Dan Moore tried to close the Law School believing the school was not cost effective. Dean Sampson developed "The Sampson Paper" which documented the detrimental impact the closing of the Law School would have on the Black Community. Dean Sampson's position was finally accepted and the Law School survived Governor Moore's attack.\*

In 1967, Dean Sampson conducted a survey to determine the need for an evening program.\*

These are only a few of Dean Sampson's tireless contributions to our Law School. Let's show him our appreciation on Thursday November 5th!
