APRIL 28, 1993

Students who took a picture for the Placement Bulletin but have not turned in your Biographical Information Sheet should do so immediately. The completed forms are needed in order to complete your entry in the Placement Bulletin.

The SOUTHEASTERN MINORITY JOB FAIR will be held in Atlanta, Georgia on Friday and Saturday, August 20 - 21, 1993. Any first, second, or third year students interested in attending must pre-register by Friday, April 30, 1993. Pre-registration forms are available in the Placement Office. Only pre-registered students will receive further information regarding the job fair.

As part of an effort to recruit talented students and increase diversity in its Bar, approximately twenty Delaware legal employers are participating in the second annual Delaware Minority Job Fair to be held in Wilmington, Delaware on Saturday, September 18, 1993. The Job Fair, which is by invitation only, is limited to students who will be in their second or third year of law school during the 1993-1994 school year. If selected, you will be scheduled for at least four half-hour interviews. There are no application or registration fees. To become eligible for an invitation, you must complete a one-page application form and send it, along with a copy of your resume and law school transcript, to the Delaware Minority Job Fair no later than June 4, 1993. For more information or to pick up an application, please stop by the Placement Office.

If you are working in or near Raleigh over the summer, you'll want to attend the American Judicature Society (AJS) Sidebar Seminar. The seminar will feature a diverse panel of state and federal judges who will address pertinent courtroom issues. The seminar will be held on July 14, 1993 from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Marriott Hotel. The fee for the seminar is \$25.00, which includes a membership in AJS. Enrollment is limited to the first seventy (70) students to register. JULY BAR EXAM WRITING CLINIC: The Minorities in the Profession Committee of the North Carolina Bar Association announces its July Bar Exam Writing Clinic to all interested persons. The focus of this clinic is to provide assistance to minority bar candidates with an emphasis on analysis of bar exam questions and writing clear, concise answers to those questions. This program will deal with the substantive law only to the extent necessary to provide a review of the practice examinations that are given to course participants. The clinic will be held on Saturday, June 12, 1993, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the North Carolina Central

University School of Law. Young Lawyers from the Triangle area will serve as advisors and critique your answers to sample bar exam questions. You must make a reservation to attend the writing clinic.
